PLANED is currently running a scoping exercise to look at this but, from prior work carried out by PAVS into the feasibility, it is likely that amounts of funding required to secure adequate longer terms returns might be prohibitive. In the past PAVS and the Port of Milford Haven have worked jointly to deliver Treats for Time and the Port also invested in the GrantNET service. There could be other future opportunities along a similar vein of partnership which would be worth exploring.
